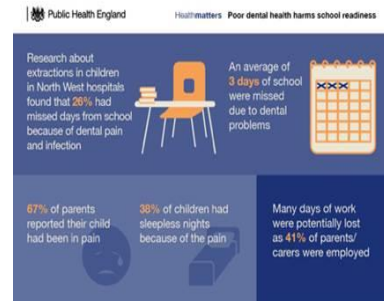
We would also welcome all donations for the tombola and children's raffle as soon as possible and any cakes and sweet treats on the day.

Message from NHS Oral Health



The key messages to help children have the best oral health they can are

1. Brush teeth last thing at night and at one other time in the day with a fluoride toothpaste
2. Reduce consumption of sugary foods and drinks
3. Visit the dentist regularly
