We have had an engaging and fun week in year 1.

Over this week in literacy we have continued to look at the traditional tale of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff', and have developed our understanding of adjectives. Next week we will look at changing the story to have different characters.

During maths this week we have been learning all about how to partition numbers into tens and ones, and using this knowledge to help us order numbers by size. Next week we will start to look at addition using objects.

Over this week we have been learning about RE, in particular exploring the story of creation from Christianity. We created our own special things, and talked about different ways that humans should look after the earth.

Next week we will be celebrating Black History Month in our CLC lessons, looking in particular at the life of Rosa Parks and her contribution to the American civil rights movement.

In Science we will continue to look at materials and their properties and uses.
