Particular focus will be given to the following skills:

Developing fluency and comprehension skills

Composition of texts writing with fluency and stamina

Description using adjectives (including expanded noun phrases and adverbial phrases)

Selecting and using the appropriate structure and features for a text type can select vocabulary and tone that reflects the level of formality required (Standard English/colloquial/formal etc)

Consistent use of grammar and punctuation in writing

Spelling is consistently accurate can use visual recall of commonly used words to support spelling and can use tools such as dictionaries and words banks to support spelling. Hand-writing is joined and legible

Comparing and ordering numbers up to 1 million
