


Year 5 Home Learning



Please find attached the Year 5 home learning activities for the week commencing Monday 11th January 2021. Each day has an English, maths and topic or other curriculum activity.

Each day, your child's class teacher will host a meeting on Microsoft Teams at 10:45 am to explain the home learning for the day to your child. These links will be sent out to you as soon as possible. If you have any difficulty accessing this please email the school office. In addition to this, your child's class teacher will host a second live lesson daily at 2:20pm.

During our time away from school, we will be using the Oak Academy platform (<https://classroom.thenational.academy/subjects-by-key-stage>) for our daily maths and English lessons. These high-quality lessons have been approved by the government and ensure national curriculum coverage. These lessons come in the form of videos which can be viewed from any device with internet access. The videos are designed to be paused at signposted points where the children complete tasks. The lessons have been created as a sequence to ensure progression and therefore are best accessed in the order suggested below. Simply click the links below on the appropriate day to begin the lesson. Additionally, children can use their Mathletics and Rockstar accounts to access a variety of topics, including problem solving activities to challenge themselves further. Please email the Year Group teacher if your child does not remember their login details.

Teachers will be available throughout the day via email to support your child in their home learning, but may also be in school teaching, so we will appreciate your patience.
