Orchard News

This term within the Orchard classes, we have applied a new approach of incorporating the Intervention Attention Autism (Bucket) into our Literacy and Math's inputs to promote engagement and concentration.

In Math's, we have been working on number recognition, correspondence, and number formation through practical table activities. Also, we have been applying our number skills to count multiples of 2,5 and 10. The children have been using arrays to share equal groups, using equal groups to solve simple addition number sentences.









In Literacy, we have been studying the text 'The Queens Hat' and looking at London landmarks within the story such Big Ben, the London Eye and Buckingham palace. The children have applied their knowledge of colourful semantics to structure sentences including the 'who', 'what' and 'what doing'. Also, continuing to develop their letter formation skills through sensory writing activities as well as their communication skills through Makaton and symbol exchange.





We have introduced TEACCH activities to support our children in becoming independent leaners. TEACCH activities link in with what the children are learning in Math's and English, these activities differ from pattern and number sequencing, matching visuals- to-visuals and fine motor skills.

A huge well done to this year's Talent Show Winner:


Aadit Thuse (Year 1)

The Reading Agency has teamed up with the Youth Sport Trust for a challenge celebrating play and participation. This year's theme will encourage children to engage in reading, games and sport and keep their minds and bodies active over the summer.

Children aged 4 and over can complete the challenge by enjoying six books over the summer, collecting stickers and rewards along the way. Those that finish will be awarded a medal and certificate to mark their achievement. The challenge presents reading as a fun and enjoyable activity and encourages children to become lifelong book lovers. It helps prevent the trend for reading skills to dip over the summer holidays, and enhances and supports the school's reading initiatives.
