- Communication between parents and school we are using Primary Site. School App no log in details were sent to parents
- Sims App not all parents received school reports
- School App can we put 2 contacts to receive a message?
- Teacher 2 Parents app seemed to work better
- When communication goes out, make sure it is correct before it is sent. Level of spelling mistakes made in school communications is high
- Emails need to be condensed (too much information)
- Parents do not receive any positive news about their child until Parents Evening. Could a text message be sent with praise?
- Forms links do not always work. Some parents missed out on clubs because they could not access the link. When they could, all clubs were full
- Not enough information to the parents of children that are 'average performing'

# 5 minutes in groups and 5 minutes feedback **How do we do it?**

- Consistently update Peek of the Week, can we add upcoming events/ some additional focus for parents to help children with.
- 2. Longer parent teacher meetings or more frequently parents ask for an additional meeting if they have specific concerns, or the teacher invites them in before parents evening if there are concerns to discuss. Allocate more time to specific pupils
- 3. The School App, the SIMs App do different things but none of them particularly user friendly.
- 4. Monitoring of communication sent out often errors on letters which then get resent often have several of the same letter. noted that this has got better.
- 5. Survey forms cannot access them.
- 6. Communication parents would like more feedback from teachers.

- 1. Raise in middle leaders SLT to do a monitoring check.
- 2. Take to SLT and middle leaders and discuss what the
- 3. SIMs APP is not user friendly can we combine the School App with other apps that do all the jobs. Parents would like a school App that improves communication between teachers and parents and makes that interaction more direct.
- 4. Take to SLT and middle leaders letters are usually quality checked.
- 5. Should be a setting that we can set on forms so that it is always set to anyone can respond check with Jeff but also remind all staff on how to set it so that anyone can use it.
- 6. SLT to look into possible APPs that make this possible without adding to work load.
