

KS2 SATs and 11+

- Year 6 SATs take place in May each year.
- The children will be tested to see if they have met age related expectations in reading, grammar, spelling and Maths. The skills assessed are taught across year 3, 4, 5 and 6 (the entirety of KS2).
- Writing and Science are teacher assessed.
- We no longer complete CATs papers in Year 5.
