

Our Learning - This week:



Communication and Language Development:

Children have been working hard during their phonic sessions this week, especially with tricky words that you cannot sound out!

Our focused tricky words this week are:

They have also been learning some new phonemes (sounds) to help them with their decoding:

z qu ch
zebra queen cherries

please continue to read with your child, it really does make a difference.



Maths:

This week the children have been investigating mass. They have been looking at different objects and predicting which one is heavier. They then have used weighing scales to see if their predictions were correct. They have learnt that the heavier object will always make the weighing scale bucket go down, forcing the object in lighter weighing scale bucket to go up!

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

This week the children have continued to look at our class mascot - Nadine and her beacon of hope. We have compared her life cycle from egg to butterfly to our learning journey. Understanding we will continue to grow and change during our time in reception through our learning and experiences. We are also beginning to understand it is ok to make mistakes as they help us learn.

Our Learning

In Computing, we learned about desktop and laptop computers. The children then had an opportunity to practice using a laptop. We completed tasks which involved clicking and dragging using the laptop trackpad, solving a variety of online puzzles.

We are thoroughly enjoying our Science topic this term! This week we looked at animals in our local environment, and discussed the different features of these animals. We then made some fantastic observational drawings of two animals, and compared their features (fur, quills, feathers!)

Art this week was focused on colour and texture. We studied the artwork of artists including Matisse and Shonibare, before having the opportunity to mix our own complimentary colours and paint onto a range of surfaces.

Our assembly this week was all about World Religion Day. We celebrated on Friday with our Multicultural day, and it was fantastic to see children in their cultural clothing. During outdoor provision, the children had opportunities to learn about different world religions and discuss what was important to them.



Our Learning

This week in English, we learnt about the features of a persuasive letter, so that we will be able to draft our own persuasive letters to Mrs Foster next week. In maths, we began our unit on money and have reminded ourselves of the value of different coins and what they look like. We have also been using our coins to make different amounts.

In science, we set up an experiment to test what conditions plants need to grow.

In the garden we have loved investigating our small world tuff tray! We have really enjoyed digging in the soil and 'planting' fir branches!



Next week, we are going to draft a letter to Mrs Foster in English, asking her to consider building a new garden at Priory School. We will try and convince her with our persuasive arguments and reasoning! In maths, we are going to be focused on counting pounds and pence to work out how much money there is in total.



Our Learning

This week, we began to learn about the Ancient Egyptian civilisation. We explored who the Ancient Egyptians were and looked at a timeline of key events.

In Maths, we have been learning how to multiply a 2 digit number by a one digit number.



In English, we continued to read and write sentences inspired by our text 'The Happy Prince'.

Next week, we will have the opportunity to become archaeologists and visit an 'Ancient Egyptian tomb' in our history lessons. We will also learn about Ancient Egyptian beliefs and about the process of mummification.

In Maths, we will start to focus on learning the 12x table and how to multiply and divide by 10 and 100.





In Science, we created a factfile about the history of astronomy



Our Learning

This week, we continued our Science topic focusing on Space. In particular, we looked at astronomers and discussed diversity within this area of science and history. We also became experts on the planets and on spherical bodies.

In maths, we started our new topic of multiplication, where we explored new strategies to multiply 4 digits by 1 digit and 2 digits by 2 digits.

In English, we began to watch One Small Step- a story about a girl called Luna- and will eventually retell this narrative in our own words.

This term in PSHRE, we will be looking at Dreams and Goals. Here we will focus on the values of hope and trust.

Next week, we will continue to explore our solar system and focus on day, night and phases of the moon!

In maths, we will continue our topic of multiplication, where we will expand our learning by learning new strategies to multiply 3 digits by 2 digits, and 4 digits by 2 digits.

In English, we will be continuing to write effective sentences for our short film: One Small Step.



Our Learning

This week, in science, we finished our topic on evolution and inheritance. We conducted an investigation into Darwin's finches. We also had a go at camouflaging our own peppered moths in the classrooms!

In English, we drew on our knowledge of the Industrial Revolution in our poem. We understood its impact on nature and animals – including the moth.

In maths, we completed the topic of decimals by focusing on multiplying and dividing decimals by integers. We then began a new topic on fractions, decimals and percentages, looking at how to convert between decimals and fractions.

Next week, in geography, we will start our new topic on the Americas! We will identify some of the countries and learn about the wide range of climates and biomes.

In English, we will use our knowledge of Natural Selection to write our own narrative poem on Darwin's finches, explaining how they have adapted over time.

In maths, we will learn how to convert between decimals, fractions and also introduce percentages. We will also start memorising key conversions, e.g. $1/2 = 50\% = 0.5$

PSHRE Focus: Dreams and Goals. In PSHRE this term, we will understand the difference between realistic and unrealistic goal-setting. We will be able to identify our learning strengths and the steps we need to take to achieve our goals. We will share our dreams for the world by identifying problems and discussing our concerns with other people. We will understand how to work with others to help make the world a better place. Lastly, we will be able to recognise and celebrate our own achievements when our goals are met.

This week in English, the children moved on to learning about trains this week. They enjoyed role-playing different train station roles, including ticket officers, conductors, and train drivers. The children also completed sentences describing different types of trains, developing their language and writing skills.

In Maths, the children continued to strengthen their understanding of one more and one less, building strong foundations in number sense. They also explored partitioning numbers and practiced number recognition, using a range of transport themed practical activities and visual resources to support their learning.

Our Science learning focused on the forces of push and pull. The children took part in a practical experiment where they explored different movements and evaluated whether each action involved a push or a pull.

Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to share an update on how we will communicate first aid and minor injuries in school from the 19th January 2026.

To ensure you receive information more quickly and consistently, we are moving away from paper medical slips and using our digital communication system via the Arbor app and email.

What this means moving forward:

- When first aid is applied, you will receive a notification through the app or an email immediately.
- For minor head bumps (including head bumps that would previously have resulted in a phone call home), we will now send an email instead of calling every time.
- We will still contact you by telephone if:
 - We assess that the injury **may require further medical care**, or
 - We feel it is appropriate for you to assess the injury in person.

Head injuries:

- Emails relating to head injuries will include:
 - Brief details of the injury and treatment, and
 - Guidance on monitoring for signs of concussion, in line with current head injury advice previously shared via paper slips.

Injuries caused by behaviour incidents:

- If first aid is required following a behaviour-related incident:
 - you will still receive the **immediate app/email notification** for first aid, and
 - the **class teacher will share further context with you when appropriate**, either:
 - at the classroom door at the end of the day,
 - via telephone call, or
 - by email

Our priority is to ensure communication remains **timely, clear, and focused on pupil safety**, while reducing unnecessary delays caused by paper-based systems.

Thank you for your continued partnership and understanding as we implement this improvement.
