Our Learning


This week, wehavelearnt abutwhat life was like in Roman Britain and the legacy of the Roman invasion.

Our Learning

This week, in geography, we learnt how to read maps using 4 and 6 grid references. We had the opportunity to apply our skills to an orienteering activity around the school grounds.

In English, we had the chance to write our own character description of a magical teacher, using our knowledge of the story..

In maths, we started a new topic on addition and subtraction focusing on using the written method accurately.

Next week, in DT, we will begin planning and designing our own magic wands inspired by Harry Potter. We will think carefully about its design and the qualities assigned to each one! Then we will use our creations on Hogwarts Day!

Peek at the Week Woodlands



In afternoon sessions this week, the children have been learning about their social skill super powers. They have been discussing how our senses help us cope in social situations and begun to create their own social scripts. The children have spent a little bit of time practicing their social scripts in woodlands.





It has been a very productive week in woodlands this week! Our reception children have settled so well into their new woodland routines and have really enjoyed listening to a range of rhymes during carpet time.

Meanwhile, our Year 6's have been focusing on how to read a timetable. They have been looking at a range of different secondary- style timetables. We have been discussing when each lessons occur and the equipment they will need to pack for the lesson the night before school.

The woodland AM group have been continuing recapping phase 2 and 3 phonics sounds. KS2 have become really confident in using a sound mat to support their spelling and are becoming more efficient in finding the sounds they needs.

In maths, we have continued with the topic of place value. Our Woodland badger group have been focusing on numbers within 10 and have been practicing counting using a range of objects. Our woodland owl group, have started to look at number lines to support their understanding of tens and ones.

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU TAKE TIME TO READ THIS INFORMATION WHICH OUTLINES THE APPLICATION PROCESS FOR A YEAR 7 SCHOOL PLACE

Dear Parent/Carer,

If your child was born between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015, and you live in Slough, you can now apply online for a transfer from primary (Year 6) to secondary school (Year 7) for September 2026.

The Citizen's portal on the council website is now open to receive applications. There are clear and simple prompts to guide you through making your application.

You will also find the *Starting Secondary School booklet* on the council website. The booklet contains a wealth of information to help you choose the right schools, make an application and understand how the application process works. It provides a profile of all of Slough secondary schools alongside information about admission arrangements.

Who should apply?

Current Year 6 pupils - children who will be transferring from primary (Year 6) school to secondary school (Year 7) in September 2026.

When do I need to apply?

You can apply anytime from 1 September 2025. To receive an offer of a school place on national offer day, you must submit an application by 31 October 2025.

Please note: In order to maximise your chances of being offered one of your preferred schools

- You MUST submit an application with any required documents/ supplementary forms on time.
- Your child MUST meet the admissions criteria of the school to be offered a place.

- NO automatic transfer from a primary into a secondary school.
- NO automatic offer of a sibling place without making an application.

Apply online at www.slough.gov.uk/school-admissions Closing date to apply 31 October 2025

Changing your preferences or changing the order after submitting an application

You can make any changes to your application before the closing date. However, if you wish to change your preferences after



the closing date or you wish to change the preference order, all your preferences would be considered as late applications and considered after all on-time applications.

It is possible to change your preferences after your application has been downloaded by the Admissions team but you will need to complete an amendment form which you will find on the council's website.

What happens if I miss the closing date?

For the avoidance of doubt, all applications submitted and received after the closing date (31 October 2025) will be deemed as late applications. They will be considered after those that are received on time and after the first round of offers have been made.

How do I apply?

If you live in Slough you MUST apply through Slough Borough Council. The easiest way to apply is online.

Go to www.slough.gov.uk/school-admissions and follow the instructions on the screen.

If you do not have internet access at home you can still apply online at your local library or at the council offices.

Who can make the application?

Applications must be made by a parent or carer who holds legal parental responsibility for a child. Only one application should be made per child.
