Headteacher's News

Thank you to all the parents who joined us for Tea with SLT on Tuesday, 11th November. It was such a lovely and productive discussion, covering all sorts of school matters — from SATs, reading at home and the 11+, to secondary school choices, lost property, and (my personal favourite) the ever-popular topic of cars parking on Orchard Avenue.

We talked about how parking there can cause real difficulties for those driving in and out of school and, more importantly, for families walking with buggies or trying to cross the road safely. I really value the open, honest feedback from parents who came along and the constructive ideas shared about how we can continue to make Priory even better.

We'll be inviting EYFS and KS1 parents to the next Tea with SLT session in the Spring term, and I'd love to see more families join us — the conversations are always relaxed and genuinely helpful. On a related note, we've received a kind email from a local resident on Mead Way who has noticed some litter being dropped at drop-off and pick-up times. We know that most of our families take real pride in our community, so this is just a gentle reminder to everyone to help keep our surrounding streets tidy by taking litter home or using the bins provided. A little care makes a big difference to our neighbours — and to the reputation of our school.

Communication has now gone out to parents about our first Learning Together Week. Please remember that these sessions are invite-only, as we can accommodate just ten parents at a time, but across the year every parent will have the opportunity to attend a session. We're really looking forward to welcoming families into classrooms to see learning in action.

We have also started promoting our Christmas Fair, which will take place on Friday 5th December. This is always one of the highlights of the year and our biggest fundraiser, so we're really excited about it. We are still a little short on donations — especially toiletries, children's games, and items for the tombola — so if you are able to gift anything to the school, we would be so grateful.

A huge well done to our amazing Year 5 and 6 girls' and boys' football teams, who took part in the Slough Town National League Cup this week.

Both teams played brilliantly, showing great skill, teamwork and determination — and incredibly, both made it through to the finals alongside Lynch Hill School!

Our boys' team showed fantastic grit and resilience, especially after losing 4–0 to a team earlier in the tournament, only to face them again in the final. They battled hard, played their best football, and narrowly lost 1–0 – a brilliant comeback and a real show of perseverance.

Our girls' team went one step further, winning their final and earning a place in the next round! This marks their second football competition win in just two weeks — a superb achievement that reflects their teamwork, sportsmanship and drive to succeed. What made us most proud, though, was not just their performance on the pitch, but their attitude, encouragement and support for one another — as well as the boys cheering the girls on in their final and vice versa.

Mr Watson said, "It was a brilliant showcase of teamwork." Well done to every single player – we are so proud of you all!

Finally, we're doing our best to spread the word about our wonderful school to families with children starting Reception in September. We've created new leaflets and adverts promoting our Stay and Play sessions and Priory tours. 

Our Learning

This week, we have continued to work on addition in maths. We locked the big number in our heads and then used counters or our fingers to count on the smaller number (e.g. 53 • 5 = 58).



In English, we completed our research and also enjoyed drawing our own labelled pictures of our African animals to go on our final fact files. In Geography, we have looked

at the human and physical features of our local area, as well as those of a small Kenyan village in Africa.

We loved painting poppies in the garden this week, to show our appreciation and respect for the soldiers who fought for our country.



Next week, we will be drawing on blank number lines in maths to help us add 1-digit numbers to 2-digit numbers, as well as adding multiples of ten (e.g. 40 +20 = 60). We will be editing and writing up our fact file sections in English, ready for us to assemble them! In geography, we will be exploring the features of different types of maps, as well as creating our own!

Our Learning


This week, Science lessons focussed on the diets of animals and humans. We learnt why it is important to eat a balanced diet and the different groups that particular foods belong to.

In French , we learnt how to say different colours.

In Maths, we revised the 2x, 5x and 10x tables using a range of strategies including arrays.

Our Learning


This week, we continued to work on saying, reading and writing numbers to 10 in French. In English we explored the characters in our text and wrote a setting description of a farm.

In Maths, we completed an arithmetic and a reasoning assessment to check our progress so far,

In DT, we made pizzas and reflected on how successful our recipes were. In Science we have begun a unit of work focussing on the digestive system beginning with a look at the different types of teeth.

Next week, we will be learning about how our knowledge of teeth can help us identify the diet of animals by looking at their skulls. We will also learn the location, name and function of different parts of the human digestive system.

In Maths, we will be exploring perimeter.



In French we will be leaning the names of different colours.

Computing lessons will focus on creating media using sound.

Our Learning

This week, we continued with our Science unit and we also explored vector drawings in ICT this half term.

In maths, we continued to apply multiplication strategies to help support us within common factors, prime numbers and square numbers.

In English, we finished our Goodnight Mr Tom unit by creating a newspaper article about how the evacuees settled into Little Weirwold.

In PSHRE, we explored which communities the children are part of through games and activities.

Next week, we will continue exploring the migration of refugees and will begin our learning on mountains, earthquakes and volcanoes.

In maths, we will continue to explore multiplication and division. Here we will specifically learn to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000.

In English, we will begin our unit on Azzi. This is a picture book which explores the impact of WW2 on our world and the journey of a refugee family as they search for safety.



Our Learning

This week, in history, we will continue our monarchy unit by learning about King John I, the importance of the Magna Carta, and Henry VIII.

In English, we started our new learning on biographies. We looked at inspirational figures in Black history and have focussed on writing sentences about Malorie Blackman.

In maths, we continued to explore fractions. We focussed on how to order, compare, add and subtract fractions.

Next week, in art, we will revisit symbolism, focusing on royal portraiture. This linked to our history, in which we began our topic on the history of the British monarchy.

In English, we will be planning and writing our own biography on an inspirational figure in the black community,

In maths, we will continue to explore fractions, focusing on adding and subtracting mixed numbers and solving multi-step problems.

PSHRE Focus: Celebrating Difference. In PSHRE this term, we will learn to accept that everyone is different and understand that there are different perceptions of 'normal'. By the end of the unit, we will know how to help someone who is being bullied and explain ways in which one person or a group can have power over others. We will learn the importance of using kind words by appreciating people for who they

It was a great experience for all of our students, who demonstrated courage and represented our school with pride. A huge well done to the team!




