Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been a strong start to the summer term—thank you for the continued support you show our pupils and staff. Although this is a short half-term, it's packed with important moments, from SATs for our Year 6 pupils (w/c 12th May) to pupil progress meetings and curriculum monitoring across the school. Please also note that Learning Together Week has been moved to the week commencing 30th June—we're looking forward to welcoming you in for shared learning experiences then.

This term, we're focusing on the value of Courage—being brave and true to yourself, even when it's hard. For our pupils, this could mean trying something new, starting a task without asking for help, or saying sorry after a disagreement. We're proud of how our children continue to grow in confidence, kindness, and determination every day.

Finally, I'd like to remind families about parking on Orchard Avenue. Personal, Social & Emotional Development

We have been welcoming our new children to Nursery this week. We have been sharing with them our class behaviour charter:

We have had lots of exciting activities this week linked to our "Growing" topic. We made the most of the sunshine and planted lots of seeds – carrots, cucumbers, beans and sunflowers! Fingers crossed we see some seedlings sprouting soon.

Maths






Our Learning


We have had an exciting and busy week in Year 2! In **English**, the children wrote some wonderful seaside setting descriptions using adjectives and adverbs to add more detail.



We were also surprised to find a note from a snail in our classroom! Then we all helped rescue the whale that was stuck on Priory Beach and wrote a recount to explain what had happened!

In maths, we have been solving division by grouping. For example, 16 divided into equal groups of 8 makes 2 equal groups.

Next week in English, we will be preparing for and then writing our first diary entry as the Snail, describing our travels around the world and focusing first on visiting the desert. In maths, we will be using our timetable knowledge to help us solve division number sentences dividing by 10 and dividing by 2.

Our Learning

This week, in English, we have begun to construct a story inspired by the Pixar animation, 'The Blue Umbrella'. In Maths lessons, we have been learning how to measure capacity and volume using litres and millilitres, In Science, we have begun to learn more about plants building on our prior learning in Year 2. This week we focussed on the function of roots and the stem. In PSHRE this term, we will look at relationships. This week we discussed gender stereotypes relating to different careers and jobs in the home.



Next week, we will be learning about the function of leaves and dissecting a flower to identify the reproductive organs. In Maths, we will explore equivalent measures and take part in some practical measuring activities. In PSHRE, we will explore strategies we can use when we have friendship issues.

Our Learning

This week in English, we have been reading 'Arthur and the golden rope'. The children have been writing sentences focusing on using effective vocabulary to describe a setting and ways to show how a character is feeling rather saying what the character is feeling.

In Maths, we have been working really hard to adding fractions and mixed numbers. We have continued to remember that the denominator tells us how many parts there are and therefore how many parts are needed to make a whole.

Next week in English, the children are going to be writing their Norse mythology stories based on 'Arthur and the Golden rope'. The children will also be thinking about what the main character feels at different parts in the story.

In Maths, we are moving on to looking at decimals. The children will be learning about what a tenth represents and how to represent it on a diagram.

In the afternoons in science, the children are going to be learning about what makes a simple circuit and then having a go at making one.

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Our Learning

This week, we continued to explore crime and punishment throughout the ages in history. Here, we became time detectives and looked for trends across periods of time and reflected on the impact of religion on beliefs around crime and punishment.

In maths, we focused on calculating angles around a point and on a straight line. We challenged ourselves further with calculating angles within regular and irregular shapes.

In English, we continued our topic on The Highway man, and explored a variety of poetic devices within our writing.

In PSHRE, we focused on a variety of aspects aiming at online gaming, communities and building relationships safely.

Next week, we will start our new topic in History, with a focus on rail transportation and the changes over time.

In maths, we will start our new topic with a focus on co-ordinates on a graph and the translation of shapes.

In English, we will continue The Highwayman in more detail and will focus on exploring character, language and emotions, and incorporating it within our writing.

Our Learning



This week:


In English, we went on a sensory walk to the garden, following instructions on how to get there. We wrote our own instructions on how to plant a seed including what equipment we need and the method we used.



In Maths, we continued to work on our skills for number consolidation. To support our learning in one to one correspondence we used vegetables from the garden to count out the correct amounts shown on the number line, as well as counting the number of times we banged on a drum.

We counted on from numbers between 1-100 in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In Science, the children learnt what a plant needs to grow and made their own watering cans to water their plants in the green house.



Now that the sun is out please can you send your child into school

with a sun hat, water bottles, sun cream and lots of spore clothes for water play. To help keep the children cool in the heat please could you send children to school in shorts and t-shirts (summer uniform).

The children will be learning how to independently take care of themselves in the sun, putting on their own sun cream and communicating when they need shade, a drink and are feeling hot.
