

to 'choose it', 'use it' and then 'put it away'. They are very good at saying our rhyme but sometimes we need to encourage them to put it into action!!





This week, we have started to tidy our garden ready for summer!






#### Our Learning

#### This Week:

In math, we continued focusing on addition and subtraction within 20. The children practiced subtracting on a number line by counting backwards. Initially, this skill was quite tricky for them, but they have shown great determination and have become much more confident! Next week, we will focus on finding the difference between two numbers up to 20.



In English, we reflected on the farm trip that took place last week, taking time to share our favourite and least favourite parts of the visit. The children then wrote their own recounts of the trip. 

#### Our Learning

This week we have been so proud of the Year 3 and Year 4 children who performed their wonderful performance of 'Finding Nemo'. The children loved learning the songs, dressing up and performing to their families. It was an absolute joy to see the children lighting up on the stage and showing off their amazing talents.

In English, the children have moved on to the new book 'The boy at the back of the classroom'. The children have been learning about the author and starting to think about the main character.

In Maths, the children have been continuing to work out the perimeter of rectilinear shapes with missing lengths. The children found this challenging so we have continued to practise this throughout the week.

This week, we started our RE unit on the Islam. In our first lesson, we looked at a range of artefacts and made inferences about the people who may have used them.



#### Our Learning

**This week,** we continued exploring the Islamic Empire before starting our RE unit in which we learnt all about Islam as a religion.

In maths, we continued to learn new strategies across percentages, linking them to: fractions, decimals, rectilinear shapes.

In English, we researched our chosen topic and wrote our own persuasive pitch focusing on either walking to school, fast fashion or planting trees in public spaces.

This term in PSHRE, we began our 'Healthy Me' topic and looked at making healthy choices as we grow older.

Next week, we will begin our art unit which focus on pattern making, photography and mix media artworks. We will learn about tessellation; Islamic geometric and vegetal artworks; Lalla Essaydi's photography; calligraphy; and Yayoi Kusama's installation pieces.

In maths, we will complete our assessments in arithmetic and Reasoning.

In English, we will complete Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Assessments and a Reading Assessment. This will support the children to develop their test stamina and build up their confidence for the SATs next year.

#### Our Learning

We will know about different types of drugs and how they affect the human body — particularly the liver and the heart. I will understand that some people can be exploited and made to do things that are against the law. I will know why some people join gangs and the risks this involves. I understand what it means to be emotionally well and can explore people's attitudes towards mental health/illness.



"We sent two staff members on the previous training, back in the summer, and have booked for another to attend on 25th, however, because of the excellent feedback from the first two staff members, we'd love to send the rest of our staff. Can I add another eight to the one I've booked for 25th please?"

"Thank you for the resources. It was a fantastic training day. It really got everyone thinking about the needs of the children and we have something concrete to support them moving forward. The second part of the day we focused on what we need to put in place to support children's sensory processing needs, but in a more inclusive way so all children will benefit. We are now better informed about sensory circuits and can plan and ensure we incorporated all 3-stages and reflected on the active movement start we do with all children too.

## Introducing our Designated Social Care Officer (DSCO)

#### So, what does a DSCO do?

Primarily it's to have a passion and commitment to promoting and developing quality services that promote inclusion and positive outcomes, for our Children and Young People with Special Educational Needs and/or Disability. (SEND).

#### Social care and SEND

The DSCO is the single point of contact for information in and out of social care, ensuring social care meets its statutory responsibilities, by providing quality advice for Education Health & Care Assessments, joining up our plans and interventions with Education and Health. Also, ensuring social care contributions to annual reviews. When plans and meetings join up it is easier for parent carers, and children and young people, and makes the best use of our resources.

#### Listening and learning

An important part of the role is listening to the experiences of parent carers, and children and young people, understanding what works well, and what we can do better. This supports co-production, working together to make positive changes including in our systems and processes.

#### Preparing for adulthood

Working with colleagues in adult social care by ensuring we understand the support a young person may need beyond the age of 18. Effective preparation for adulthood and 'transition' ensures an effective handover to adult services, encouraging and supporting independence, inclusion, and a purposeful adult life.

#### **Quality matters**

This involves quality assuring colleagues' work, through auditing advice and files, so we can identify and share best practice and keep learning.

#### Inclusion, independence and success

And finally, it's about championing the needs and the inclusion of our children and young people with additional needs, by having a good understanding and appreciation of the challenges faced, having high aspirations and expectations, and looking for ways to encourage skills and independence, across all our services and local communities.

So, I don't think I'll have any time to be bored. There is much to be celebrated and built upon in the work within social care and the SEND partnership, but clearly there is a more to do. I welcome the challenge and look forward to working in partnership with everyone, so we can proudly say and evidence that our children and young people with SEND are Happy, Safe & Loved, Thriving.

#### Slough Local Area Partnership Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Inspection

Agencies in the Slough Local Area SEND partnership are expecting an imminent phone call from Ofsted and CQC to announce a Local Area Partnership SEND inspection.

Most parents and carers are familiar with the Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (OFSTED). This organisation inspects all our education settings and social care services. Some parents and carers are less familiar with the Care Quality Commission (COC). They inspect our Health Services and General Practitioner Services. Together these agencies will inspect the quality of the Special Educational Needs and Disability services across Slough (SEND) focusing on the experiences of children and young people with SEND aged 0 to 25 who need extra support to learn and grow.

Area SEND inspections also include looking at services for children and young people who live in the local area, but go to school or are cared for in other areas.

The inspection process aims to find out about the positive and not so positive experiences, of parents and carers, and children and young people, who receive services. This includes education services e.g. schools, early years settings and colleges; health services including CAMHS and therapies such as Speech and Language Therapy; care services such as Early Help and support from the Children with Disabilities Team and the offer of short breaks. Inspectors will also talk to Special Voices (our Parent Carer Forum) and other parent groups.

Crucially inspectors want to know how well local services work in partnership to improve the lives of children and young people with SEND.

## SEND Team Update/Phased Transfer

It's been an incredibly busy few weeks in the SEND team as all school aged children with EHCPs who are moving from Nursery to Reception, and Year 6 to Year 7, go through what is called 'Phased Transfer'.

This means that the SEND Team have been working under pressure with parents and schools to name the children's schools for September 2025. Our performance has

improved this year and next year it will be even smoother.

Taking on board feedback from schools and parents, SEND team managers are carrying out briefing sessions on improvements to Phased Transfers for the next cycle. We will be consulting with schools and parents to arrange these sessions post Easter, so please look out for announcements.

#### Upcoming careers event hosted by Together as One and Slough & Langley College

This March, we are thrilled to partner with Slough & Langley College to host our inaugural careers event specifically designed for young people (16+) with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

The full event will take place on Wednesday 5 March, 9.20am-2pm, at the college, offering an enriching day for these young individuals to:

- · meet with employers
- connect with people who have SEND and are thriving in the workplace
- learn new skills through interactive workshops.

The aim of the day is to spark an interest in different careers, and for students to find out about different work opportunities that will inspire them. While the structure of the day will feel familiar to many of you, we've tailored it to better meet the needs of the attendees. For instance, we will closely manage the

number of participants at any given time to avoid overwhelming those affected by sensory overload.

The day will consist of three sessions:

- stallholders to showcase opportunities and inspire attendees from 9.20am-12.40pm
- individuals within your organisation who have SEND and are willing to share their journeys will do so from 10am-1.20pm
- skills workshop leaders from 10.40am-2pm.

We look forward to hosting what promises to be an impactful and inspiring event.
