It has been wonderful to welcome everyone back to Priory this week and to see our children settling quickly into their new routines. As always, everything we do is driven by our vision of growing pupils who are kind, courageous and determined, and by our values of hope, opportunity, trust, and curiosity. I encourage you to take a moment to revisit our Parent Handbook, which sets out how we can work together to give every child the best start to the year.

This term, our behaviour focus is Kindness. Kindness is one of the key behaviours we believe are essential for learning and life. It is the foundation that allows our values to flourish – kindness helps children feel safe to take opportunities, it builds trust, it encourages hope, and it opens curiosity about others. You will see this celebrated across classrooms and assemblies in the weeks ahead.

We also have some events coming up: year group parent meetings begin the week of 15th September, flu vaccinations will take place on Thursday 18th September, and the school photographer will be visiting on Monday 22nd September.

Finally, I want to take this opportunity to remind families about safety when travelling to and from school. Recently, I have seen a number of children not wearing seatbelts in cars. Wearing a seatbelt reduces the risk of death or serious injury by around 50%, and it is a legal requirement for all children to be secured in the correct car seat or seatbelt for their age and size. Please help us keep every child safe by ensuring seatbelts are always worn, even on the shortest journeys.

As the weather is getting cooler and the rain has started to arrive, please can you ensure your child comes to school with a rain coat or jacket as we will be continuing our busy learning outside.

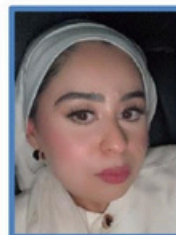
Please can we ask that your child brings in a named water bottle every day. Additionally can we ask all school uniform is named.

Communication and Language Development:

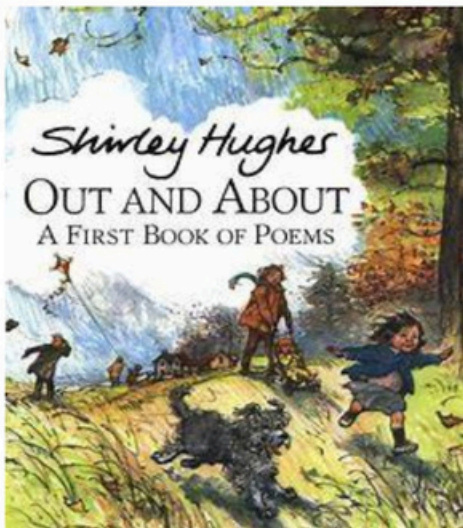

This week:

In Maths, we have started our unit on place value. We have been sorting objects and practicing our counting to 10.

Our Learning

This week, the children have enjoyed learning about The Great Fire of London in our history lessons. They have used drama to act out what happened and went on a scavenger hunt to find out more facts about this significant event. In English, we have been writing questions and using adjectives to write descriptive sentences about fire and in maths we have been focusing on the place value of 2-digit numbers, using lots of different concrete resources to show how many tens and how many ones each number has. The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring and learning in our new Year 2 garden this week. They have all settled in really well to their new classes and routines this week. Well done Year 2!

Next week, we will be comparing firefighting nowadays with how it was in 1666 and learning about the famous diarist, Samuel Pepys. In maths, we will continue with our place value topic, looking at how to partition a 2-digit number into tens and ones.

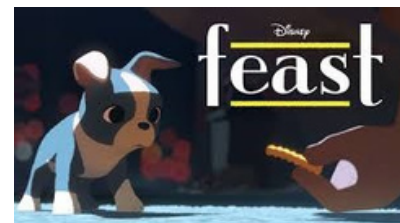

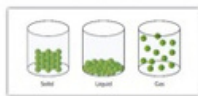

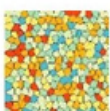

We enjoyed playing parachute games in science this week!



Our Learning

This week, we began our science unit on forces. We played parachute games, learnt about Galileo and Newton and recorded our findings from our very own experiment involving air resistance and surface area.

In maths, we explored place value from 10,000 up to 1,000,000.

In English, we started reading the book 'Rose Blanche' and discussed the plot points in the story. We used drama to explore characters' inner thoughts and wrote sentences to portray characters' emotions.

Next week, we will be continuing our science unit on forces. Here we will build on this week's knowledge and apply this to water resistance, pulleys and levers. In art, we will also begin our unit on propaganda posters by looking at recent posters encouraging us to "Stay at Home" during the pandemic.

In maths, we will continue place value focusing on powers of 10, partitioning and writing numbers using words.

In English, we will continue to explore Rose Blanche and sentence stacking.

Our Learning

This week, in art, we learned about symbolism and linked this to the Hogwarts houses, exploring the qualities associated with each house.

In English, we were introduced to our first text of the year: [Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone](#). This is an exciting unit that is an overarching theme across our autumn term curriculum.

In maths, we have been exploring place value up to 1 million.

Next week, in art/DT, we will create our own crests using animals to represent ourselves. we will use two influential architects as inspiration to design our own magical shop in Diagon Alley.

Dear Parent/Carer,

If your child was born between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015, and you live in Slough, you can now apply online for a transfer from primary (Year 6) to secondary school (Year 7) for September 2026.

The Citizen's portal on the council website is now open to receive applications. There are clear and simple prompts to guide you through making your application.

You will also find the **Starting Secondary School booklet** on the council website. The booklet contains a wealth of information to help you choose the right schools, make an application and understand how the application process works. It provides a profile of all of Slough secondary schools alongside information about admission arrangements.

Who should apply?

Current Year 6 pupils - children who will be transferring from primary (Year 6) school to secondary school (Year 7) in September 2026.

When do I need to apply?

You can apply anytime from 1 September 2025. **To receive an offer of a school place on national offer day, you must submit an application by 31 October 2025.**

Please note: In order to maximise your chances of being offered one of your preferred schools

- You **MUST** submit an application with any required documents/supplementary forms on time.
- Your child **MUST** meet the admissions criteria of the school to be offered a place.

- NO automatic transfer from a primary into a secondary school.
- NO automatic offer of a sibling place without making an application.

Changing your preferences or changing the order after submitting an application

You can make any changes to your application before the closing date. However, if you wish to change your preferences after



the closing date or you wish to change the preference order, all your preferences would be considered as late applications and considered after all on-time applications.

It is possible to change your preferences after your application has been downloaded by the Admissions team but you will need to complete an amendment form which you will find on the council's website.

What happens if I miss the closing date?

For the avoidance of doubt, all applications submitted and received after the closing date (31 October 2025) will be deemed as late applications. They will be considered after those that are received on time and after the first round of offers have been made.

How do I apply?

If you live in Slough you **MUST** apply through Slough Borough Council. The easiest way to apply is online.

Go to www.slough.gov.uk/school-admissions and follow the instructions on the screen.

If you do not have internet access at home you can still apply online at your local library or at the council offices.

Who can make the application?

Applications must be made by a parent or carer who holds legal parental responsibility for a child. Only one application should be made per child.

Year 4 and 5 Virtual Reality Workshops

Imagine travelling back in time and experiencing life in Ancient Rome or living through The Blitz for yourself! This September, we would like to invite Year 4 and Year 5 pupils to do just this. As part of our history units, Ancient Rome and WW2, we want to bring the curriculum to life using immersive technology and give our pupils the opportunity to explore these important periods of time using Virtual Reality.

Year 4 Pupils

Your class will step foot inside the mighty Colosseum and travel back in time to see what the streets of Ancient Rome were really like. Pupils will compare the poor plebeian society with the extravagant lifestyle of the patrician upper class. Using 360° imagery and video, PrimeVR will transport pupils to this important period of time and show them some detailed reconstructed scenes of Ancient Rome itself.

Year 5 Pupils

Sparked by the 1939 Nazi invasion of Poland, WW2 is considered the biggest and deadliest war in history, involving more than 30 different countries around the world. Your class will be transported back in time so that they can discover this period of world history for themselves. Using 360° imagery, PrimeVR will transport pupils back in time so that they can learn about some of the key events that unfolded during WW2.

The workshop will take place on **Thursday 18th September 2025**. We are asking for a voluntary donation of **£5.00 per pupil**; if sufficient funds are not received we may have to cancel this workshop. Please go to your Arbor account and pay via the School Shop.

Autumn Term 2025

Dear Parent/Carer,

Your Child is Now Eligible for Their Annual Flu Vaccine Your child will be eligible for their annual flu vaccine this autumn (This is offered to all children in Reception up to Year 11). For most children and young people this will be offered in school, however if your child does not currently attend school, please continue to complete a **yes** or **no** consent form following the details below and then contact us to discuss a community clinic appointment.

Flu can make children very poorly, and the vaccine helps keep them safe. Even if your child had the flu vaccine last year, they need it again this year.

1. Nasal Flu Vaccine (*contains a small amount of porcine gelatine*)

This is the most effective flu vaccine for children. It is a quick, simple, and painless spray administered into the nose.
