Our Learning

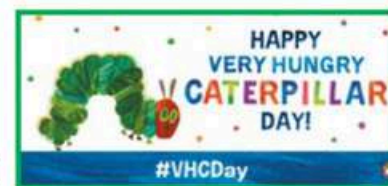
Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Our Learning - This week:



Communication and Language Development:

We have started a new phonics phase and have been learning the sounds: 'air' and 'er'. We have been blending words using the sounds we have learned, and we have been reading and writing sentences. Please take some time to review these sounds at home with your child. Continuing to read together regularly makes a big difference, thank you for your support!

Furthermore, the children are applying their phonics skills in Drawing Club, where they are creating "magic codes" to bring their pictures to life. This week, we have been watching the cartoon, "Fraggle Rock". The focus has been on drawing the character, setting, and adventure (changing the character or setting). Children have learned new vocabulary words such as: **society, postcard, convention, annual, universe, imagination.**

This week in Literacy, we have been learning about the story *Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion*. The children have been practising their early writing skills by writing a caption for the picture.

Please also practise the following tricky words at home: **the, of, I, put, pull, full, was, they, you, push, was, by, all, into, are, sure, pure.** Becoming confident with these words will greatly support your child's reading progress.

In maths, we have been learning about the number 9. We explored different ways to make 9 using a part-whole model and practiced finding 1 more, 2 more, and 3 more than a number.

In Phonics this week we have looked at the trigraph **ear** which makes the ear, air and ur sound. It is found in words including **hear**, **pear** and **learn**. Look out for this trigraph when reading with your child this week!

As part of our RE topic this term, Christianity, we were invited to St Peter's Church on Tuesday. Year 1 had a lovely walk up to the church, past the park and through Burnham high street. At the church, Reverend Josh spoke to us about Easter celebrations and the Christian story of Easter. We then took part in some lovely craft activities, and the adults were so impressed by Year 1's beautiful manners!



In Maths, we have been counting up to 50 and have begun looking at counting in 2s and 5s. We noticed patterns when counting and used Rekenreks to subitise (recognise groups of numbers).

Our Learning

This week in English, we have completed our story plans. We have focused on using adjectives to describe our character and adverbs to explain how they were doing something, e.g. The friendly King was out skipping cheerfully.

In maths, we have continued to work on solving multiplication number sentences using our fingers, times table knowledge and by drawing arrays. We have also applied our learning to solve word problems and answer reasoning questions.



In RE, we have been looking at how people show respect in different religions and how we show respect at school. We then drew a picture and described someone that we respect.

In the Year 2 garden, we have enjoyed celebrating St Patrick's day! We have also been using our fine motor skills to 'catch stars'! We are very excited for Eid!

Next week, we will begin to write our stories in

English. In Maths we will start looking at the properties of 3D shapes and learn about the significance of Passover for Jewish people, in RE.

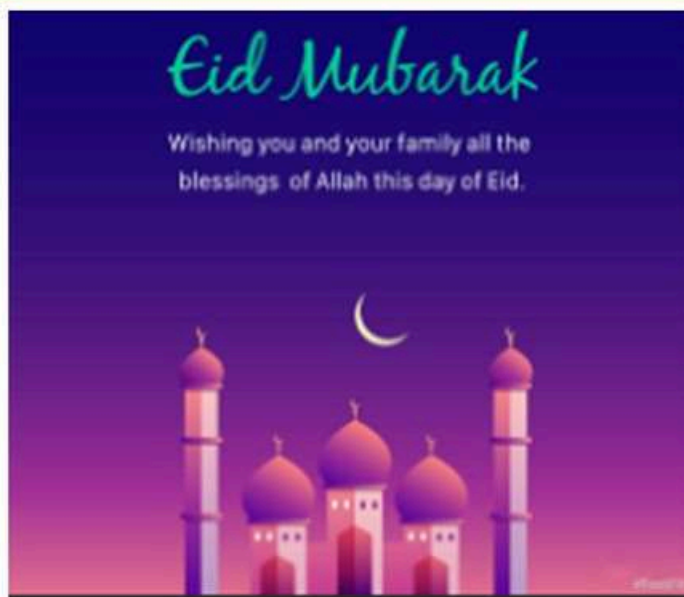

Our Learning

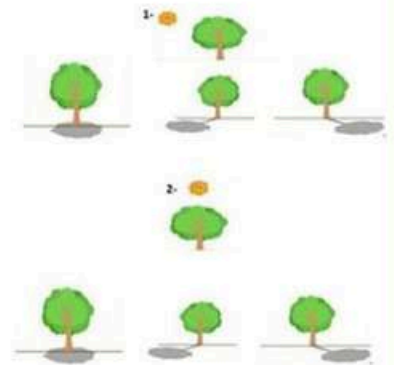
This week, we really enjoyed our visit to St Peter's Church in Burnham where we learnt more about how Easter is an important festival for Christians.

On Friday, we supported Red Nose Day in school.

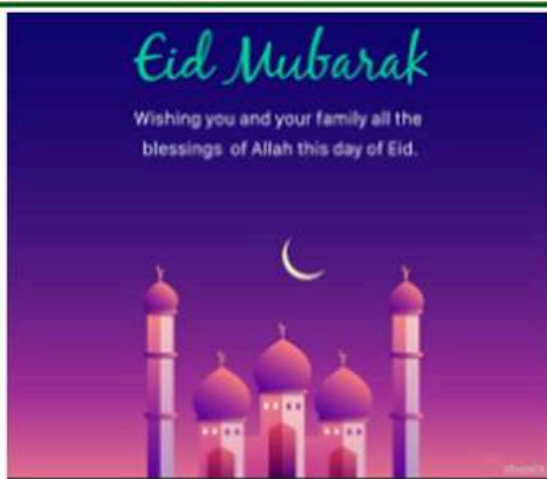

Our Learning

This week, we have been partaking in a collaborative project with Burnham Grammar School and Burnham Park Hall. We created a piece of art that will be used in the under-stair areas of the village hall.

In maths, we continued to focus on our topic of perimeter and area, and focus on strategies linked to polygons, rectangles and compound shapes.

In English, we started our new book '1001 Arabian Nights'. We made predictions about the story and explored a selection of traditional tales.

This term in PSHRE, we will be celebrating Neurodiversity and learning all about ASD, ADHD, dyslexia and dyspraxia.

Next week, we will start coding in ICT using Microbits, we will look at algorithms and making name badges using LED displays.

In maths, we will focus on drawing graphs and interpreting the information provided. We will further our mathematical skills by learning new strategies within two-way tables and interpreting timetables.

In English, we will continue to explore 1001 Arabian Nights through drama and retellings. Here, we will be comparing traditional tales to the adaptations in this text. We will then be creating our own version of a traditional tale that could become another chapter in 1001 Arabian Nights.

Our Learning

This week, in **art**, we drew our own self portraits with sketching pencils inspired by Frida Kahlo's work.

In **history**, we were introduced to the Ancient Maya civilisation and came up with questions about what we wanted to know about them.

In English, we wrote the next chapter of our class text, *The Last Wild*. The children have worked hard to create imaginative, engaging narratives.

In maths, we started our new topic on shapes by recapping types of angles. We measured angles using a protractor and learned how to calculate missing angles.

Next week, in **art**, we will explore how Frida Kahlo expresses her heritage in her artwork. We will create a self-portrait that expresses our own culture and identity.

In English, we will continue reading *The Last Wild*.

In maths, we will continue our shapes topic by learning about vertically opposite angles, as well as angles in triangles and quadrilaterals.

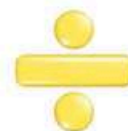
Our Learning

Music and Early Word Learning in Autism

Learning new words can sometimes take longer for autistic children, and using those words in different situations can also be challenging. While we know a lot about how children learn language in general, we still do not fully understand what best supports autistic children who experience language delays. Many autistic children show a strong interest in music, and research suggests the brain may respond more strongly to song than speech. This study explores whether music could support word learning in young autistic children.

We are looking for:

- Autistic children under 6 with little or no language (diagnosed or awaiting assessment)

The study involves:

- 2-3 visits to the University of Reading (4 hours total)
- Standardised assessments of autism, language, and cognitive skills
- Word learning task with and without music

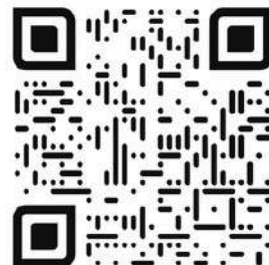
