This week we have been reading the story 'Lulu loves Flowers'. We have been finding the different verbs (doing words) and acting them out. We have been doing the


actions for 'writing', 'choosing', 'buying' and 'planting'. What other verbs can you help your child to act out at home?


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## Peek at the Week Year 1 – 9<sup>th</sup> May 2025

#### Our Learning

#### This week:

In maths this week, we have continued our unit on multiplication and division. The children have been exploring arrays to represent quantities and have learned the key vocabulary: *column* and *row*. They worked really hard to showcase their understanding through written explanations, and we are very proud of their efforts!



In English this week, the children have been busy planning their own piece of writing to explain why an animal of their choice would not be able to use a type of transport from the past. Next week, they will use their plans to write their explanations independently. Their writing will not only showcase their understanding of adjectives and different punctuation marks, but will also give them the opportunity to demonstrate what they have learnt during our history





topic.

#### <u>Our Learning</u>

In English this week we have been collecting

descriptive phrases to describe the Sahara desert, Amazon Rainforest and London. We will use these in our diary writing next week, when we will write in role as the Snail and pretend we have visited these places on the back of the huge, humpback who

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the huge, humpback whale.

In maths, we have used our knowledge of the ten and two times table to help us solve division number sentences dividing by ten and two. For example to solve 60 ÷ 10, we counted on our fingers to see how many 10s we needed to make 60. We have also



enjoyed learning about the history of the seaside and how it has changed over time, from the bathing machines of the Victorian period, to deckchairs in the 1950s.

to how we use the seaside now. In the garden, we enjoyed using construction blocks to build our own beach huts at the seaside.

Next week in English, we will be writing our diary entries about our travels as the Snail. In maths, we will be using our timestable knowledge to help us divide by 5 and starting our unit on finding fractions of a shape. We will also be having a DT day on Thursday, where we will design, make and evaluate a seaside vehicle with moving parts!

We have been learning about capacity and volume in Maths.

#### <u>Our Learning</u>

This week, we have been learning about the function of leaves. During an outdoor learning lesson we drew some scientific illustrations to show how plants turn towards the light. We also dissected a flower to identify the reproductive organs.

In Maths, we have been exploring equivalent measures and took part in some practical measuring activities. In PSHRE, we discussed strategies that we can use when we have friendship issues.

Next week, we will be returning to the topic of fractions in Maths. Our focus will be on adding and subtracting fractions. In Science, we will learn about the life cycle of plants and how seeds are distributed in different ways. In Design and Technology, we will begin a unit of work where we learn how to make pop-up books. In English, we will continue our unit linked to the Pixar animation, 'The Blue Umbrella'.

## Year 4 Peek at the Week Friday 9th May 2025

#### <u>Our Learning</u>

This week in English, we have been continuing to write sentences based on 'Arthur and the Rope'. The children have been thinking about effective vocabulary and how to describe characters' feelings.

In Maths, we have started learning about decimals. The children are now confident at understanding the relationship between tenths as a fraction and a decimal.

Next week in English, the children are going to be writing their stories based on Arthur and the Rope. The children will spend some time making a plan and then writing their independent piece thinking about how they can make their writing flow effectively.

In Maths, we are continuing to focus on times tables, please ensure that your child is practising as much as possible.

In the afternoons in science, the children are going to be learning about how a switch can be used in a circuit and then the children will be creating their own switches.

Fridays: Spelling test. Please remember to read at least three times a week and record it in the reading record. Your child also need to be practising their times tables as much as possible.

#### Our Learning

This week, we started our second History topic, with a focus on rail transportation and the changes over time. Here, we will also explore Brunel and his impact on our local area. We also started our art unit, where we will be learning to draw with accuracy.

In maths, we focused on co-ordinates on a graph and the translation of shapes.

In English, we continued The Highwayman in more detail. We explored character, language and emotions through drama, and incorporated this within our writing.

## **Year 6 Peek at the Week** Friday 9<sup>th</sup> May 2025


#### Important Information
