## Our Learning - This week:

This the children have been getting to know their daily routines such as learning time, lunch time and of course their first PE session! They have done extremely well settling into these routines and we are very proud of all the reception children!

#### Communication and Language Development:

This week we have begun our Little Wandle Phonics Program! So far we have learnt the phonemes (letter sounds) **s – a – t - p** and we are beginning to learn how to write the graphemes (letter formation). Challenage your child to see if they can find anything around the home beginning with these phonemes such as **socks – apple – toothbrush** or **pan**.

#### Maths:

This week we have continued to look at number and matching objects. The children have been looking at how to sort objects according to their size, colour, shape or actual objects. They have been very busy sorting the animals according to their appearance such as spots – stripes – plain.



#### Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

This week the children have been looking at feelings and our zones of regulation. Each zone is a different colour and linked to a core feeling. This helps the children understand their feelings and the feelings of others.

## Our Learning


This week, the children have been learning to partition 2-digit numbers into tens and ones and to



work out the value of each part. In their English lessons, the children have written speech bubbles to show a conversation between Mr Pepys and his maid, when she woke him to tell him about the huge, raging fire!

Next week, we will start our science unit on materials. The children will be sorting different materials and objects according to their properties: hard, soft, flexible, rigid etc. In our English lessons we are going to write a set of instructions from Samuel Pepys to his maid, telling her how to bury his precious possessions to save them from the fire. In maths, we will continue with partitioning numbers, moving on to flexible partitioning. We can split the number into tens and ones, but how else can we partition it?



#### Our Learning

This week, in DT, we used two influential architects as inspiration to design our own magical shop in Diagon Alley. We were also sorted into one of the school houses: Gryffindor, Hufflepuff, Ravenclaw or Slytherin.

In English, we continued Harry's journey into the magical world and met some of his magical teachers. We then had the opportunity to compare different characters based on their personality and attributes.

In maths, we continued to work on place value and applied our knowledge of number. We learnt to read and write larger numbers and compare them.

**Next week, in geography,** we will learn how to read maps using 4 and 6 grid references. The children will get the opportunity to apply their skills to an orienteering activity around the school grounds.

**In English**, we will have the chance to write our own character description of a magical teacher and a magical beast.

In maths, we will recap rounding and negative numbers. Then will start a new topic on addition and subtraction, focussing on the written methods

PSHRE Focus: Being Me in My World. In PSHRE this term, we will learn that our attitudes and actions make a difference to our class team. We will acknowledge who is in our school community, the roles they play and how we fit in. We will understand that our actions affect ourselves and others. 



Afternoon sessions have also brought our KS1 and KS2 children together to revisit the different Zones of Regulation. They have also been given lots of opportunities to practise their turn-taking skills through playing a variety of different games. They have also spent time thinking about what makes a good friend and even created their very own friendship potions!





It has been so lovely to see all the children settle back in to woodlands this week. They have all enjoyed spending times in their woodland classes.

Our Year 6 pupils have particularly enjoyed their new secondary-style sessions, where they are practising important skills for the transition to secondary school. This week, they have been focusing on organising their belongings.

In our morning groups, the children have all been recapping their phonics skills and started to learn a couple of new sounds. Our KS2 children have been looking at the place value of numbers up to 100 and have used a place value chart to help them. 

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU TAKE TIME TO READ THIS INFORMATION WHICH OUTLINES THE APPLICATION PROCESS FOR A YEAR 7 SCHOOL PLACE

#### Dear Parent/Carer,

If your child was born between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015, and you live in Slough, you can now apply online for a transfer from primary (Year 6) to secondary school (Year 7) for September 2026.

The Citizen's portal on the council website is now open to receive applications. There are clear and simple prompts to guide you through making your application.

You will also find the *Starting Secondary School booklet* on the council website. The booklet contains a wealth of information to help you choose the right schools, make an application and understand how the application process works. It provides a profile of all of Slough secondary schools alongside information about admission arrangements.

#### Who should apply?

Current Year 6 pupils - children who will be transferring from primary (Year 6) school to secondary school (Year 7) in September 2026.

#### When do I need to apply?

You can apply anytime from 1 September 2025. To receive an offer of a school place on national offer day, you must submit an application by 31 October 2025.

# Please note: In order to maximise your chances of being offered one of your preferred schools

- You MUST submit an application with any required documents/ supplementary forms on time.
- Your child MUST meet the admissions criteria of the school to be offered a place.

#### and there is

- NO automatic transfer from a primary into a secondary school.
- NO automatic offer of a sibling place without making an application.

# Changing your preferences or changing the order after submitting an application

You can make any changes to your application before the closing date. However, if you wish to change your preferences after



the closing date or you wish to change the preference order, all your preferences would be considered as late applications and considered after all on-time applications.

It is possible to change your preferences after your application has been downloaded by the Admissions team but you will need to complete an amendment form which you will find on the council's website.

#### What happens if I miss the closing date?

For the avoidance of doubt, all applications submitted and received after the closing date (31 October 2025) will be deemed as late applications. They will be considered after those that are received on time and after the first round of offers have been made.

#### How do I apply?

If you live in Slough you MUST apply through Slough Borough Council. The easiest way to apply is online.

Go to www.slough.gov.uk/school-admissions and follow the instructions on the screen.

If you do not have internet access at home you can still apply online at your local library or at the council offices.

#### Who can make the application?

Applications must be made by a parent or carer who holds legal parental responsibility for a child. Only one application should be made per child.

# Year 6 Al and Machine Learning Workshop

On Tuesday, Year 6 attended a workshop by Hyett Education, in conjuction with the RAF. The workshop introduced the children to Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning, focusing on their applications in self-driving vehicles. We learned physical computing and coding concepts with BBC micro:bit computers and then built and programmed a robot buggy with AI capabilities. The Year 6's had a fantastic time exploring the technology!
